Discuss

- How many types of bear can you name?

- How many still exist?
- What do they eat?
- Where do they live?
- Do they hibernate?

Create a project however you like. It might be a presentation from your notes, or a written and illustrated one. It's entirely up to you!

- Research more about global warming and the effects on bears including hibernation and migration.
- Create a classification chart.
- Write about your findings with photos, illustrations and references to your sources.
- Research types of poem. Does this one fit a particular rhythm or shape?
